# Big Picture: Make sure your outline

- Includes words or phrases
  - (does not include complete sentences or paragraphs of text)
- Cites your research with in-text citations
  - Cite author's last name or, if there is no author, cite the article's title.
    - *In-text citations should match your Works Cited exactly!*
  - Cite every source at least once
